“The perfect Tuesday evening on Grand Cayman is riding the \$20 water taxi from Camana Bay across the North Sound over to the Kaibo to enjoy their Tuesday night seaside buffet with live band & low-as-you-can-go limbo included.”



“One of the best places to take a break from the sun is underwater. The Cayman Islands has some of the best marine life and reefs in the world. There are even underwater statues on some of Cayman’s reefs! You can explore art in a totally different way by scuba diving. Just book a dive excursion with one of the islands’ many dive operators like Divetech and they’ll make sure you see it all.”

“Just before sunrise is the best time of day to start paddling Seven Mile beach without any jet skis, boat traffic, or anybody else in sight.”

“Areas of South Sound [Grand Cayman] have the most spectacular coral heads and marine life that you can only access from a paddleboard or a kayak because it’s so shallow.” “There are hidden entrances to the mangroves to paddleboard without seeing another person in sight.”

“There are many ways to experience The Cayman Islands. One way is by renting an open-top jeep and exploring the Eastern side of the Island. Pedro’s St. James, the Blow Holes, Lighthouse Park, Wreck of the Ten Sails, and enjoying the views along Queen’s Highway. I would also recommend a visit to the newly opened Crystal Caves, then cool off at Rum Point.”

“The best beach snorkeling spots in Grand Cayman are at Spotts Beach, Smiths Cove, and Cemetery Beach.”

“Did you know that a starfish is not a fish? Visit Starfish Point to encounter them. Staying on this quiet and shallow beach in the afternoon was well worth it and perfect for kids and kids at heart.”
